<p><b>Day 01</b></p> 	<p><b>KUALA LUMPUR [D]</b> Meet and greet at hotel, depart for Night tour</p> <p>Highlights : Evening visit to the buzzing Chinatown, it's bazaar of numerous makeshift stalls lined up to display their wares ranging from local handicrafts to almost as good as genuine designer items, try you bargaining skills here then proceed on to a local restaurant for a typical Malay buffet dinner and a vibrant cultural performance.</p> <p><i>Overnight Swiss Garden Hotel, Kuala Lumpur</i></p>
<p><b>Day 02</b></p> 	<p><b>KUALA LUMPUR [B]</b> Breakfast is served at hotel Depart for FULL DAY Malacca Tour</p> <p>Highlights : Malacca rose from a humble fishing village to become a major center of the spice trade forming a vital link between the East and the West. Melaka (Malacca) is rich with history. In fact, the earliest written records of the country made reference to the Malacca Peninsula, instead of the Malay Peninsula or Malaya. Since it's founding, circa 1400, by a fleeing Sumatra Prince, Parameswara. The journey which Parameswara made during his flight to escape the wrath of the Emperor of Majapahit whom he had unsuccessfully tried to overthrow. At the height of its power, the Sultanate of Malacca extended its borders over the whole of peninsula to encompass Pantani in the North and on the west right into the neighboring island of Sumatra to included Aru, Rokan, Siak, Kampar and Inderagiri. This was during the mid-1400s. The Golden Age of the Malacca Sultanate unfortunately lasted only for less than a century.</p> <p><b>Highlights</b> : St Peter's Church &amp; Porta De Santiago : St Paul's Church, : Dutch Square &amp; Cheng Hoon Teng Temple : Jonker Street</p> <p><i>Overnight Swiss Garden Hotel, Kuala Lumpur</i></p>
<p><b>Day 03</b></p> 	<p><b>KUALA LUMPUR [B]</b> Breakfast is served at hotel Depart for Home Stay program after breakfast</p> <p><b>Highlights</b> : Coffee Plantation &amp; Palm Oil Plantation : Cottage industry such as traditional making of local delicacies (Not available on Sundays)</p> <p>Traditional local Malay lunch will be served at the Home Stay family.</p> <p>Overland back to Kuala Lumpur after lunch, discover the old and new, starting from where the city began, which is at the confluence of two rivers. Visits include the King's Palace, the National Monument and the superb buildings at the Independence Square as well as the Moorish-style railway station.</p> <p>Observe the contrast between historical architecture and modern skyscrapers in an abundant setting of greenery. <p><b>Day 04</b></p> 	<p><b>KUALA LUMPUR / CAMERON HIGHLANDS [B]</b>                  Breakfast is served at hotel                  Morning, journey overland to Cameron Highlands</p> <p>Cameron Highlands is nestled on a plateau in the Titiwangsa Range, not far from Tapah, a few families devote their livelihood to weaving bamboo basket used for vegetable packing.</p> <p>A short stop at Orang Asli huts along the winding drive up Cameron Highlands, the plateau is marked by the rolling hill slopes of tea bushes. You may catch some workers collecting tea leaves. After check-in, you are free to explore this small town on your own.</p> <p><b>Overnight Strawberry Park Resort, Cameron Highlands</b></p>
<p><b>Day 05</b></p> 	<p><b>CAMERON HIGHLANDS / PANGKOR [B]</b>                  Breakfast is served at hotel                  We will depart for a Half Day Cameron Highlands Tour</p> <p>In this brief tour, we will take you to the Tea Plantation, Tea Factory and Butterfly farm before ascending downhill to Lumut, as we arrive at the jetty, we will take a 30 minutes ferry ride across to the Island of Pangkor.</p> <p>Pangkor Island is one of the famous and well known islands in Malaysia, it is located approximately 90 km southwest of Ipoh. Pangkor Island is an idyllic and beautiful island resort for a care free and relaxing holiday. Its natural scenery of green hills and palm-fringed beaches of fine white sand lapped by the warm blue waters of the Straits of Malacca is truly magnificent.</p> <p><b>Overnight at Pangkor Island Beach Resort, Pangkor</b></p> <p><b>Note</b> : Tea factory is closed on every Monday.                  : Clients will be free at leisure in Pangkor – without guide service in Pangkor, please refer to notes / terms and conditions.</p>
<p><b>Day 06</b></p> 	<p><b>PANGKOR [B]</b>                  Breakfast is served at hotel</p> <p>Today is a free and easy day for you to enjoy the sun, sand and sea. However, you if feel like exploring the island, one of the best ways to go on a round island trip by taxi. The trip cost approximately MYR 70.00 – MYR 100.00.</p> <p>As you travel around coastal roads, you will see quaint Malay villages with wooden houses on stilts under the shade of coconut trees. Now and then, you will catch glimpses of the white sand and the shimmering blue sea. In the forests, you may chance upon shy deer or playful monkeys darting among the branches. The island of Pangkor is mainly populated by fishing villages who occupy the eastern coastline. The island is famous for its 'ikan bilis' (anchovies) and squids. The real attraction here however are the enchanting beaches on the western coastline Teluk Belanga, Teluk Nipah and Teluk Cempedak are marvelous for swimming or just basking in the sun, in complete privacy amidst tranquil surroundings.</p> <p><b>Overnight at Pangkor Island Beach Resort, Pangkor</b></p>
